SUMMARY OF REPORT:

This report provides the regular update on consultations and policy issues that have the potential to impact on Authority operations or activities. The report confirms submission of responses to three government consultations resulting from the Resources and Waste Strategy for England and the autumn 2018 budget statement. Delegation was approved at the last Authority meeting for the Managing Director in consultation with the Chair and Vice Chairs to submit these responses.

3. PROPOSED MODIFICATIONS TO THE EDMONTON LEESIDE AREA ACTION PLAN (ELAAP)

From 14 May to 25 June 2019, London Borough of Enfield is consulting on Proposed Modifications to the Edmonton Leeside Area Action Plan (ELAAP). The ELAAP area includes the Edmonton EcoPark. Representations are invited on the 'schedule of proposed main modifications' and a 'policies map' only, at this stage of the Plan preparation process. The Authority signed a Statement of Common Ground with LB Enfield in 2018 and the amendments to the ELAAP which are included in the Statement of Common Ground are now incorporated in the ELAAP.

Principally these update the document with factual changes to reflect the award of the Development Consent Order for the North London Heat and Power Project (NLHPP). Accordingly, officers consider that it is unnecessary for the Authority to respond to the consultation. A copy of the Statement of Common Ground is enclosed as Appendix A.

4. EQUALITIES IMPLICATIONS

4.1. The impact of implementing the government consultations listed in paragraph 2.2 is unknown at this stage. However, if any equalities implications for north London are identified at the next stage of consultation, these will be set out in future reports to Members.

In 2017 a Development Consent Order (DCO) was granted for the redevelopment of the Edmonton EcoPark site that will allow for the construction and operation of an energy recovery facility to replace the existing plant, replacement facilities associated with waste management, and provision of visitor, community and education facilities.

Both parties agree to recognise the DCO in Policy EL17 through the following text updates at the start of the policy:

Redevelopment of the Edmonton EcoPark site will be delivered through the development proposals consented by the 2017 North London Heat and Power Plant Development Consent Order.
