



Waste Warriors', Schools Workshops, BreadnButter




Breadnbutter was funded to deliver an innovative sustainability workshop called 'Waste Warriors' in 10 schools in Barnet and Enfield.

Three shops were established to enable residents to swap outgrown clothing for new items with other residents, find information on how to take better care of their clothing and find out about local textiles banks. The aim of the project was to help children and their families understand how they could live more sustainably and save money by wasting less food and by increasing recycling and reuse of certain materials, in particular plastic.

The project delivered:

- 20 x 5 week programmes (2 classes per school) to classes of primary children in schools in Barnet and Enfield;
- Cooking workshops for Key Stage 2 children, who made recipes from food donated by the Felix Project;
- Four community fridges, which alongside the workshops, allowed families of school children to share food;
- Two central events, where pupils held information stalls and promoted waste reduction messages, demonstrating key ways of preventing food waste.
