<p>Any waste that cannot be recycled or composted or that is not listed in the middle column (see further guidance available from your Borough or <a href="http://WiseUpToWaste.org.uk">WiseUpToWaste.org.uk</a>)</p>	Builder/DIY waste and soil	This be taken to the North London Waste Authority Reuse and Recycling Centres. Residents can however only deposit six standard rubble sacks per month.
	Asbestos	The Corporation of London provides a chargeable service for the collection of asbestos cement only. Otherwise Asbestos waste removed by a householder can be taken to the Hornsey Street Reuse and Recycling Centre. No asbestos removed by a contractor or from other premises will be accepted.
	Car Batteries	These can be taken to many of the North London Waste Authority Reuse and Recycling Centres. Only waste car batteries arising from resident's private garages can be accepted.
	Engine Oil	This can be taken to many of the North London Waste Authority Reuse and Recycling Centres. The Corporation of London provides a free service for the collection of up to 50L of hazardous chemicals.
	Liquid Paint and Paint Thinners	<p>Liquid paint can be taken to many of the North London Waste Authority Reuse and Recycling Centres. The Corporation of London provides a free service for the collection of up to 50L of hazardous chemicals including paint thinners and liquid oil and solvent based paints*. Fully dried paint and paint tins can be disposed of through bulky waste and normal collections.</p> <p>*Paint is not accepted in London Borough of Haringey</p>
	Energy Saving Light Bulbs and Fluorescent Tubes	This can be taken to many of the North London Waste Authority Reuse and Recycling Centres.
	Any other hazardous, corrosive or dangerous chemicals or other substances	<p>These may be accepted at one of North London Waste Authority Reuse and Recycling Centres (click here for guidance on what is accepted at each site <a href="http://wiseuptowaste.org.uk/recycle/reuse-and-recycling-centres">http://wiseuptowaste.org.uk/recycle/reuse-and-recycling-centres</a>). They may also be accepted free of charge by the Corporation of London hazardous waste collection service (click here for further guidance <a href="https://www.cityoflondon.gov.uk/services/environment-and-planning/waste-and-recycling/household-waste-and-recycling/Pages/Hazardous-Waste.aspx">https://www.cityoflondon.gov.uk/services/environment-and-planning/waste-and-recycling/household-waste-and-recycling/Pages/Hazardous-Waste.aspx</a>). 	Clinical waste	The Borough provides a separate collection for relevant clinical waste. Further guidance on the management of healthcare waste can be found here.
	Items that are more than 25 kgs weight or cannot fit into your normal waste collection bin	These items should be taken to the North London Waste Authority Reuse and Recycling Centres or collected via a pre-booked bulky waste collection.
